LESSON - 2 Cursive Writing

Note for the Teachers: Like simple capital and small letters of English Alphabet, there are capital and small cursive letters. The word 'cursive' refers to the handwriting which is running. In cursive writing, the words are formed by joining the letters together. Thus, for the purpose of writing, it is these cursive letters which are mainly used.

The teacher should teach the students these cursive letters by parts and with due practice.















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





















LESSON - 3

Vowel and Consonant Letters

Use of 'a' and 'an'

The letters a, e, i, o, u are called vowel letters. All other letters are called consonant letters. The vowel letters have their independent sounds like the consonant letters but these are also used to join different letters to form meaningful words.

We use 'an' before a singular noun that begins with a *vowel sound* and 'a' before a singular noun that begins with a *consonant sound*. Both 'a' and 'an' give the sense of *any one*.



In simple words, we can say that 'an' is used before a singular noun beginning with the sounds produced by first three letters of the Punjabi Alphabet, (θ, w, v) . Before all other singular nouns, students should use 'a'.

Gender

All living beings belong either to the male or to the female sex. Thus we have *Male* and *Female Genders*. The male gender is called *Masculine Gender* and the female gender is called *Feminine Gender*.



A noun that can be used for both male and female sexes is said to be of **common gender**. Nouns like child, parent, friend, student, teacher, cousin etc. are nouns of common gender.

A noun that refers to a thing and is neither male nor female is said to be of the **neuter gender**. All non-living things like book, pen, tree, chair, table etc. come under the neuter gender. Students should be taught to learn opposite genders of the given nouns.
